The course will aim at developing the participants' leadership and professional skills. It's a great opportunity to learn from two of the most prominent and influential psychiatrists on how to make presentations and posters, read and write scientific articles, prepare a proposal for a project, produce a curriculum vitae, chair a session and also how to deal with other challenges that young psychiatrists face.

REQUIREMENTS

The training is tailored for 16 young psychiatrists within 2 years before or 5 years after the end of their specialty training. Participants must be fluent in English language and will be expected to prepare an oral presentation and a poster for the course.
